About the Program

A psychology major is an asset - whether your career goal is to become a clinical psychologist, counselor, social worker, or consultant; to conduct behavioral research; to become a college professor; or to enter professions such as business, law or medicine. Your expanded knowledge of human thought, emotion, and behavior is relevant to any career.

Develop the intellectual skills to help you generate and evaluate knowledge in many areas by learning and applying psychology research methodologies. Although not required for completion of the program, opportunities are available to gain experience in the field and earn credit through an internship placement that pairs you with a working professional in the field.

Jose Rosado, LGPC, NCC, MBA, Adjunct Professor Jose is a person in long-term recovery and a BiPOC clinician who works with adults, young adults, couples, as well as families. He runs a small private practice, *Grey Matter Counseling & Consulting*, based out of Harford County. In addition to his clinical background, Jose is also a MABPCB Registered Peer Supervisor (RPS) & Peer Recovery Specialist (PRS). Jose received his Master's in Clinical Mental Health Counseling from Northwestern University and received his Bachelor's & MBA from Iona University in New York ('06,'08). With mental health advocacy being a cause that is near to his heart, Jose founded *Creatives Against Depression* (www.creativesagainstdepression.com) — an initiative created to start a larger conversation about mental health awareness in society to help erase the stigma behind depression, anxiety, & suicide, especially in the arts community.

- TUNE students save on room and board, which costs approximately \$11,000 per academic year on the main campus.

- Please read the application instructions carefully. Allow yourself approximately 20-30 minutes to fully complete the application. A \$50 non-deferrable, non-refundable fee is required with your application. Payment may be made with a credit card or electronic check.

The Deadlines

The final application deadline is **June 1 for fall admission** and **November 15 for spring admission**. The application will remain open on a space-available basis.

To be considered for merit-based scholarships offered through the University, your TU application and official transcripts **must** be submitted by **March 1**.

The TU Priority Deadline for the FASFA is usually in mid-January and posted at www.towson.edu/finaid.
