

**MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING**  
**ANNE ARUNDEL COMMUNITY COLLEGE & TOWSON UNIVERSITY**

**August 1, 2018**

**Allied Health B.T.P.S. Degree**


Anne Arundel Community College, Arnold, Maryland, and Towson University, agree to follow the articulation of courses outlined in the articulation (course equivalency) document, for completion of requirements for the Bachelor of Technical or Professional Studies degree in Allied Health (Attachment A), which is attached to, and incorporated by reference into, this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU). The following principles guide the operation of this MOU, with the requirements for transfer in specific curricula set forth in Attachment A.


1. Towson University will accept a maximum number of 64 credits from Anne Arundel Community College as outlined in the Attachment A. The number of transferable credits specific to this program is reflected in Attachment A.
2. Students who have completed the Associate of Applied Science Degree in the Health Information Technology program at Anne Arundel Community College may transfer into Towson University's Allied Health program with junior standing provided that the student has completed all courses identified on Attachment A (which is attached to, and incorporated by reference into, this MOU) with a cumulative GPA of 2.00 or higher. Courses completed at Anne Arundel Community College with 300 or 400 level Towson University course equivalencies will transfer as lower-level credit but will satisfy course content as indicated.
3. Only courses in which a grade of C (2.00) or better is earned will apply toward the major at Towson University.
4. In accordance with the MHEC transfer policy pertaining to general education requirements, Towson University will accept the completion of Anne Arundel Community College's general education requirements (GenEds) and students will be required to complete courses at Towson University to satisfy the remaining *University Core* requirements as shown in Attachment A.
5. Towson University recognizes college-level experiential learning gained through previous work, military and/or volunteer service or life experience. Credit for prior learning may also be established through course challenge or standardized credit by examination.
6. Anne Arundel Community College students transferring to Towson University will be given every consideration for financial aid and will be eligible to compete for academic scholarships upon entrance to Towson University subject to stated scholarship deadlines.
7. Both Anne Arundel Community College and Towson University agree to work together to facilitate the transfer of students from Anne Arundel Community College to Towson University to work cooperatively to insure the high quality of the programs at the

respective institutions. Transfer of students will be in accordance with policies and procedures of both institutions, as they may be amended from time to time.

8. This MOU will be in effect initially for ten years, beginning **Fall 2018**, with a review every two years by both parties. Any revisions the parties deem necessary must be evidenced in writing and signed by the authorized officials of each institution. The MOU may be terminated by either party for due cause and after adequate notice of not less than six months is given to the other party.
9. Towson University will establish procedures to provide information on the academic progress of Anne Arundel Community College students enrolled as part of this MOU.
10. This MOU, when signed, constitutes the entire agreement between the parties and supersedes all prior agreements and understandings between the parties respecting the matter hereof.

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## AACC Course Selection

### GENERAL EDUCATION:

- 1) Students who complete ENG 121 instead of ENG 111-112 or ENG 115-116 will be required to complete Core 12 Global Perspectives at TU.
- 2) Students must take a designated Diversity course in order to satisfy AACC's general education requirements. Students should choose a Diversity course as their Social and Behavioral Science Gen Ed course unless noted in the below suggestions.

The following suggestions are based on prerequisites of elective course options or possible electives for certain tracks. Specific elective and prerequisite information can be found in the TU catalog. Application of any course to a track's electives must be approved by an Allied Health advisor. Students interested in the following tracks may consider these course recommendations:

**Administration/Management Track:** Students may consider choosing either ECO 211 Principles of Economics 1 or ECO 212 Principles of Economics 2 as their Social and Behavioral Science Gen Ed course in order to satisfy prerequisites for upper-level ECON or MKTG elective options in this track. **NOTE:** Students who choose to complete either ECO 211 or ECO 212 as their Social and Behavioral Science Gen Ed course must choose a designated Diversity course as their Health/Fitness/Wellness Gen Ed course in order to satisfy AACC's general education requirements.

**Education Track:** Students may consider choosing HLTH 101 as their Health/Fitness/Wellness Gen Ed course in order to satisfy the prerequisite of some HLTH elective options in the track.

### **Health Promotion, Wellness, Prevention & Community Health Track:**

- 1) Students may consider SOC 111 Introduction to Sociology as their Social and Behavioral Science Gen Ed course in order to satisfy prerequisites for upper-level GERO, SOCI, or WMST elective options in the track. Students may otherwise consider PSY 111 Introduction to Psychology or PSY 211 Developmental Psychology as their Social and Behavioral Science Gen Ed course in order to partially satisfy prerequisites for upper-level PSYC elective options in the track. **NOTE:** Students who choose PSY 111 must choose a designated Diversity course for their Health/Fitness/Wellness Gen Ed requirement in order to satisfy AACC's general education requirements.
- 2) Students may consider choosing HEA 111 Personal and Community Health as their Health/Fitness/Wellness Gen Ed course in order to satisfy the prerequisite of some HLTH elective options in the track. **NOTE:** Students who take HEA 111 must choose a designated diversity course for the Social and Behavioral Science Gen Ed requirement and should not complete PSY 111 as noted in the first suggestion.

### **Science and Professional Preparation Track:**

- 1) Students may consider MAT 137 College Algebra, MAT 145 Precalculus 1, MAT 146 Precalculus 2, or MAT 151 Accelerated Precalculus as their Mathematics Gen Ed course if they intend to complete PHYS elective options in the track. Students may also consider MAT 135 Statistics as their Mathematics Gen Ed course as a possible elective option in the track. **NOTE:** All major track electives must be approved by an Allied Health advisor.
- 2) Students may consider PSY 111 Introduction to Psychology or PSY 211 Developmental Psychology as their Social and Behavioral Science Gen Ed course in order to partially satisfy prerequisites for upper-level PSYC elective options in the track. PSY 211 may also satisfy elective credit in the track, subject to approval by an Allied Health advisor. **NOTE:** Students who choose PSY 111 must choose a designated Diversity course for their Health/Fitness/Wellness Gen Ed requirement in order to satisfy AACC's general education requirements.
