Nine Questions for A Solid Fulbright Personal Statement

Writing a solid Fulbright *Personal Statement* is, on the face of it, a daunting task. As with any daunting task, you can make it manageable by breaking the big task into a series of smaller ones. You may find it helpful to use this graph to plot nine specific questions that make for a strong Fulbright *Personal Statement* that links in with your *Statement of Grant Purpose*.

Is there anything about where you grew up that made you curious about the rest of the world?	Did you have a teacher/professor who challenged you to think globally?	Did you study overseas in high school or university? What opened your eyes during that time?
What about your undergraduate experiences at a personal level have stood out to you?	What about your research topic or proposed MA programs interests you personally? (Research/study applicants only)	What about teaching English overseas interests you personally? (ETA applicants only)
Have you had an experience with a culture other than your own that made you feel uncomfortable? What was that experience like?	Why did you decide to pursue a Fulbright grant?	What about your upcoming Fulbright grant excites you the most?
