



2009-2010 CITIZENSHIP DOCUMENTATION

When you applied for financial aid, the U.S. Department of Education could not confirm that you are a U.S. citizen or national or eligible non-citizen. Federal regulations require review of your documentation before Towson University can offer you financial aid. Please review the categories below to find the one that applies to you. Attach copies of the documentation and return this form to the Financial Aid Office.

- U.S. Citizen or Naturalized U.S. Citizen. Attach one of the following forms of documentation: *
 - A copy of your birth certificate, if you were born in the United States.
 - A copy of your Certificate of Naturalization (N-550 or N-570) or Certificate of Citizenship (N-560 or N-561).
 - A copy of State Department Form FS-240, FS 545, or DS-1350.
 - A copy of your U.S. Passport.

- U.S. Permanent Resident. Attach one of the following forms of documentation: *
 - A copy of both sides of your Permanent Resident Card (Form I-551).
 - A copy of your Arrival/Departure Record (CBP Form I-94) or Departure Record (Form I-94A, with the endorsement "Processed for I-551. Temporary Evidence of Lawful Admission for Permanent Residence. Valid until....Employment Authorized."
 - United States Travel Document annotated with "Permit to Reenter Form I-327 (Rev. 9-2-03)."

- Eligible Non-Citizen. Depending on your status, attach a copy the documentation shown below. *
 - Refugees: Form I-94 or I-94A with a stamp showing admission under Section 207 of the Immigration and Nationality Act (INA), or U.S. Travel Document annotated with "Refugee Travel Document Form I-571 (Rev. 9-2-03)."
 - Victims of human trafficking: Certification or eligibility letter from the U. S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), or a T-visa (e.g., T-2 or T-3) for a spouse, child, or parent of a trafficking victim.
 - Asylees: an I-94 or I-94A with a stamp showing admission under Section 208 of the IN, or United States Travel Document annotated with "Refugee Travel Document Form I-571 (Rev. 9-2-03)."
 - Parolees: an I-94 with a stamp that has not expired.
 - Cuban-Haitian entrants: I-94 with stamp "Cuban-Haitian Entrant (Status Pending)."

*Please note: The U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) and Department of Homeland Security (DHS) will permit photocopying of these documents for the purpose of applying for student financial aid. We must confirm your documentation with USCIS or HHS, and this may delay the processing of your application for financial aid for up to 30 days.
