# **3 Elements of an Effective Conclusion**



#### 1. Signal the End of the Speech

Cue that your speech is ending through language like "my purpose has been" or "let me end by saying."

Think of your conclusion like a musical crescendo that you are building toward. Depending on your topic, you may want to use a dissolved ending, which acts more like a musical decrescendo.

Use your tone, pacing, and rhythm to convey that your speech is ending.



### 2. Reinforce the Central Idea

Briefly summarize the speech. This explicitly restates the central idea and main points to remind your audience about the content of the speech.

#### 3. Thoughtful Ending

There are 3 common ways to execute this.

- End with a Quotation. Choose a brief quote that suits the urgency if your speech.
- Make a Dramatic Statement. Create your own impactful quote that is crafted to tie your speech together.
- **Refer to the Introduction.** End with a statement that ties the conclusion to an idea or story presented in the introduction.
