

As a high schooler, Ryan Armstrong was already dipping his toes into the entrepreneurial pool. Ryan and his silk-screening T-shirt company, Mossy Springs, were recognized for contributions to the local economy and his dedication, innovation and entrepreneurial spirit with a \$1,000 award from the Carroll County Chamber of Commerce and Miller Resources for Entrepreneurs.

"That experience taught me you reap what you sow," says the business administration major with a concentration in entrepreneurship. "It is fulfilling to put in the hard work and watch yourself grow."

In spring 2020, the Dean's List student took his initial entrepreneurship courses at TU and was immediately impressed by the real-world expertise of faculty members. As part of his Entrepreneurship Foundations and Pathways course, Ryan created a business plan and participated in a business competition to start a nonprofit organization to teach financial literacy to Baltimore City students. "The diversity of the coursework and the expertise of the professors has really enhanced my learning experience," he says.





ACTIONS SPEAK LOUDLY

Many people fear public speaking—the butterflies, the sweaty palms. But communication studies major Alexa Adams defies that stereotype. She fell in love with public speaking during her first term at Towson University. "I'm good at talking to people," she says with a smile. Her interest in reducing language barriers led Alexa to add a major in international studies, which allows her to learn new languages while she explores global cultures and customs. Her combined majors, supplemented with a minor in political science, create a comprehensive and powerful way to deepen cultural and societal understanding among individuals.

Alexa has received plenty of mentorship and support from TU faculty. Her firstyear adviser and communication professor, Lisa Turowski, helped her choose courses and hosted networking events that resulted in valuable connections. Professor Sarah Parker Hughes offered her the opportunity to become a mentor in the Public Communication Center, a resource for students who seek help with speeches and presentations.

In 2021, Alexa won a summer research grant to pursue her project, Public Speaking for All: Creating a More Inclusive Communication Center for ELL and Deaf Students, with the support of faculty mentor Jennifer Potter. "I have not met a COMM studies professor yet who has not been supportive, genuine and informative," Alexa says.





SIMULATION

At TU, nursing students develop and strengthen their clinical skills in our state-of-the-art simulation learning center. This 12-room, 4,600-square-foot space uses patient mannequins to recreate a broad range of health care environments. Some of the mannequins offer real-time feedback about student performance via Bluetooth connection to one of the lab's computers. These clinical simulation scenarios teach students to quickly and successfully manage myriad patient care situations that fall outside the scope of traditional classroom study.



THE INSTITUTE FOR

WELL-BEING

The Institute for Well-Being offers a wide spectrum of programs dedicated to promoting and enhancing health and wellness in the community. Here, you'll receive training and mentorship from a team of licensed and certified health care experts as you learn best practices in health and wellness. The institute is made up of four centers: the Hearing and Balance Center, the Hussman Center for Adults with Autism, the Occupational Therapy Center and the Speech & Language Center.

FACULTY HIGHLIGHTS

Mary Nadelen, clinical associate professor of kinesiology, is researching the Functional Movement Screen (FMS) and the Y-Balance Test (YBT) to predict and possibly lower the risk of injuries in adolescent football players. Along the way, she's helping her students earn their level 1 FMS certification.

An internship opportunity at the Pro Bowl landed Sara Bianco on the football field and gave her firsthand exposure to the actionpacked world of sport management.

After taking a college-level course in sport management while in high school, Sara searched for a comparable program when applying to college.

For years, researchers insisted these disorders weren't valid; Brand and her team have since proven them wrong, making history and giving new hope to patients with dissociative disorders.



FACULTY HIGHLIGHTS

Jess and Mildred Fisher Endowed professor of mathematics Hervé Nganguia, Ph.D., is working on research sponsored by the National Science Foundation. His interdisciplinary project uses applied mathematics and physics to model and optimize targeted drug delivery, a clinical method to improve patients' experience with medications.

Samantha Topka chose TU for its fully accredited forensics program. "Accreditation is given out to only a handful of programs for forensics," she explains.

""I was told about how TU students got to involve themselves with research, and I saw the opportunity to grow and expand my potential."

During the second semester of her freshman year, Samantha leapt at the chance to collaborate on a research project with Mary Devadas, Ph.D. She quickly came to see Devadas as a mentor. "She always looks over my applications and abstracts and gives me feedback when I need it," she says. "She convinced me to pick up a chemistry major, too. She really inspired me."

Samantha's research is focused on the use of gold nanoclusters in combination with other metals; she hopes the results will drive improvements in chemical warfare sensors and gunshot residue identification. With Devadas' encouragement and support, she won the Research Impact Award in 2022. Samantha was also recognized as a Goldwater nominee and given a summer research grant to continue her work on campus. This fall she plans to apply for the Gates Cambridge scholarship, which would allow her to pursue her doctoral studies in England.


