Students are expected to achieve A and B grades and meet with their advisor if they are struggling; entry into graduate school is highly competitive and primarily dependent on undergrad GPA.

I understand that failing a course, not getting into the major, taking a leave of absence, etc. may alter my plan. Instructions for completing the Degree Completion Plan (DCP)/Program of Study (POS) document

In order to help you plan your academic program of study the Department of Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology created this document that *all* pre-majors and majors are required to complete. This document will help you plan out your 4 years here at Towson University. Please note: changing your major, adding a minor, double majoring, failing a course, etc. may impact your program of study and ultimately your 4-year plan.

1. Fill in all of the classes you will register for (and/or have taken at TU) in the boxes on page 1. Enter the total number of transfer credits if applicable. You can also find this information in your Academic Requirements and transfer credit report in your PeopleSoft account. Please remember that you need to take 15 credits each fall and spring semester in order to meet the 120 credits you need to graduate. Some semesters you may have 16 and others 14 but use 15 credits as a guideline for your planning (NOTE: some science and math courses are 4 credits). Extra boxes are provided in the event you plan on taking summer or winter minimester courses.
2. Next, fill in the courses you would like to take over the next 4 years. It may be easier to put CORE 5 in a blank spot (as opposed to a specific course)! The prerequisite courses, SPPA major courses, additional required courses and electives are listed above. SPPA Major classes must be taken in the term and order listed in this document. If you enter the major as a Sophomore, your 1st year of SPPA classes will be taken during your Sophomore year and your 2nd year of SPPA classes will be taken during your Junior year. Your last SPPA major class (SPPA 417) will be taken fall of your Senior year. If you enter the major as a junior (or transfer student) your 1st year of SPPA classes will be your Junior year and your 2nd year of SPPA classes will be your Senior year. SPPA 417 will be taken spring of your Senior year.
3. Please remember that you need 32 upper level credits (300 and 400). It is possible to complete all major requirements but not have 32 upper level credits, so please be sure to count your courses carefully.
4. You need to complete this document before you meet with your advisor each semester and update it with any changes. There will be several open house meetings where the Speech-Language Pathology & Audiology (SPPA) Program Coordinator will be present to answer questions or help you complete this document.

Admission to the Major: Speech Language Pathology & Audiology is a screened major. Students apply for full admission to the major after completing the following steps:

1. Attend a SPPA Undergraduate Major Open House
2. Complete the SPPA Pre-Major Application form (on-line)
3. Complete all 5 pre-major courses by May 31 with a minimum GPA of 2.8. Pass/fail not allowed.
 - ENGL 102 or 190** English Composition (3)
 - MATH 115* or 119*** College Algebra, pre-calculus, or above (3)
 - PSYC 101 or 102** Intro to Psychology (3)
 - BIOL 191/192 or 200** Biology for Health Science Majors with lab or Cellular Biology (4+)
 - One class from Group A or Group B:** Group A: CHEM 121+121L, PHYS 202 or 211 Group B: SOCI 101/102, ANTH 207/210, EDUC 203
4. Complete a minimum of 27 credits (Most recent 27-30* credits used for ranking) with a minimum GPA of 2.5.
5. Declare PSPA major in PeopleSoft or on your TU application
6. Complete a speech, language and hearing screening (1st week of classes Fall & Spring)

Ranking for the Major: Ranking for admission into the SPPA major is calculated as shown below. Competitive GPA for ranking is > 3.2; GPA for ranking between 3.0 and 3.2 may be competitive.

$$\frac{GPA (5 \text{ pre - major classes}) + GPA (30 \text{ credits} *)}{2} = GPA \text{ for ranking}$$
