Joanna Wuest is an Assistant Professor of Politics at Mount Holyoke College. She writes on law and civil rights, sexuality and gender, and the politics of science and health. She earned her PhD from the Department of Political Science at the University of Pennsylvania. Her book, Born This Way: Science, Citizenship, and Inequality in the American LGBTQ+ Movement, tells the history of the LGBTQ+ rights movement, the modern scientific study of gender and sexuality, and the identity politics that formed at the nexus.

Janelle Wong is Professor in the Departments of Government and Politics and American Studies and Director of the Asian American Studies Program at the University of Maryland, College Park. She received her PhD from the Department of Political Science at Yale University. Wong is the co-author of three legal briefs submitted in the SFFA v. Harvard case that focus on social science research and support for race-conscious admissions. She recently published an essay in the Los Angeles Times with Viet Thanh Nguyen titled "Affirmative Action isn't Hurting Asian Americans, Here's Why that Myth Survives."
