Peer to Peer Features

- Expert mentors who have a wealth of experience: Drawn from Baltimore City and Prince George's County, where community schools have existed the longest, mentors offer their advice and mentoring.
- Independent Development Plan: Mentees design their own goals for their work in consultation with a mentor to make sure they feel more confident in their work.
- Monthly meetings with a mentor: A full year of mentoring around from the six key

practices of community schools.

- **Master classes**: Our mentors offer additional workshops in key areas to do a deeper dive for a broader group beyond the mentees, but for those who want to learn.
- **Meetups**: In person meetup possibilities from site visits to connection at our annual conference.
- Monthly Interactive Virtual Sessions: Mentors and mentees get additional assistance through monthly interactions with Center staff.
